PARENT GOVERNORS

Every half term the governing body meet to support the work of the school. The governing body is made up of parents, staff and other members of the community who, together with the Headteacher, are responsible for a wide range of matters affecting the life of the school and the work of students.

An election of parent governors for the Local Governing Body of the School will be held in about a fortnight's time. If you would like to be a candidate or to put forward the name of another parent who is willing to stand, please complete the nomination paper below. If you wish to nominate more than one parent, additional nomination papers are available from the Headteacher. It is in order to propose yourself or to get your partner to do so. All nominations must be seconded by a parent, other than the candidate or the proposer, of a pupil at the school. Candidates are also asked to make themselves known to other parents by saying a few words, on the back of the nomination paper or in a separate letter, something about themselves and what they would hope to do for the School if elected. When completed, the nomination paper should be returned to the Headteacher by **22nd September**.

If insufficient parents are nominated for election the Governing Body is required under the 2002 Education Act to appoint, without election, parent governors from parents with children at the School or, a parent of a former pupil of the school or, from parents with children of or under compulsory school age at another school(s).
